

LEADING THE WAY

Dr. Grace Blest-Hopley

Director of Research, HHP

Grace earned a Ph.D. in the neurochemical and neurofunctional effects of cannabinoids following completion of a Masters in Neuroscience at King's College London.

As a research associate, she has continued to research in the field of cannabinoids and mental health, particularly using neuroimaging techniques. Grace has a keen research interest in plant medicine research and how these may be used therapeutically, as well as the mechanisms and risk factors behind the development of psychological disorders. She is currently serving as a member of the reserve armed forces.



BILLS AND POLICY MAKING



Joined **Veteran's Mental Health Leadership Coalition** formed by **Reason for Hope-Hope for Reason** and introduced ***Right To Try Clarification*** with senators Cory Booker and Rand Paul. www.vmhlc.org. This same coalition introduced the ***Breakthrough Therapies Act*** with senators Cory Booker and Rand Paul.



Heroic Hearts Project supported and promoted Colorado's ***Natural Medicine Act*** which passed in November, 2022.



Connecticut's governor signed a bill to create a **Psychedelic Treatment Program** that provides funding for MDMA and psilocybin-assisted therapy to qualified patients with serious mental health disorders, ending when these substances are approved for medical use by the DEA. Qualified patients include veterans, retired first responders, healthcare workers, and those from underserved communities without access to effective mental health care.

OUR COACHES

Weekly Group Integration calls saw an increase in participation of approximately 80% from beginning of the year to the last call of the year.

Provided scholarships to 3 veterans for the “Being True to You” Coaching Certification Program. All 3 have joined our coaching team

1,182 total number of hours of individual integration and group coaching calls + 549 hours of breath work and mindfulness courses

Launched Bespoke HHP Mindfulness & Breathwork Course required to be completed by all participants before retreat

The saying, “home is where the heart is” has always baffled me. I have spent the majority of my life searching for “home”. Years of recovery, therapy, and medicine work taught me how to learn to follow my heart. Last year, my heart led me to Yelapa, Mexico for an Ayahuasca retreat with Heroic Hearts Project. It was clear HHP made a careful effort to put love and compassion into every aspect of the retreat. The facilitators and coaches were professional, heart-centered, and were there to support the journey, individually and collectively. By the end of the ceremony, my heart was shouting at me, “This is home, this is home.” I knew these were the people I wanted to learn from and serve with; I knew they could change the world because they had changed mine. At the end of my integration period, I mentioned I wanted to coach for HHP and I wanted to help other people find their Heroic Heart, just as the team had helped me find mine.”

A HEARTFELT MESSAGE AND SUCCESS STORY FROM ONE OF OUR AMBASSADORS

Corey Champagne, a Marine Corps veteran, transitioned to social work after injuries in service. Inspired by The Combat Coach on Instagram, he joined HHP as an ambassador, found healing through psychedelics, and now studies Graphic Design.



I'm Corey Champagne, and I served in the Marine Corps. I come from a military family, and after graduating high school, it felt like a right of passage to serve and understand what my family endured. Unfortunately, my experience wasn't positive. I sustained severe injuries and experienced major trauma. After service, I attended flight school. That went well until I could no longer fly due to the VA's rating. I moved and started working as a social worker, coaching those with developmental disabilities at their job site. I discovered HHP after seeing Kasey Pippet's Instagram page, The Combat Coach. I resonated with his words of wisdom and decided to apply to be an ambassador. After a few months, HHP soon helped me prepare for an Ayahuasca journey in the Peruvian Amazon. That experience spiritually brought me to my knees and allowed me to process and let go while feeling all the emotions I lost connection with. It wasn't easy and, at some points, terrifying, but I ultimately felt supported and loved in ways I didn't imagine possible. After purging a lifetime of agony in a bucket, I connected with something intensely creative within myself and now knew the path to take. I wanted to be of service to others, working with this medicine and other psychedelics while expressing who I am in creative ways.



OUR STORY

Jesse Gould, a former Army Ranger, was plagued by severe PTSD after he returned home from combat. After quitting his job as an investment banker, selling all of his possessions, and wandering the world, he found himself in an ayahuasca retreat in the jungles of Peru. To his surprise, Jesse found that his symptoms of PTSD disappeared after the retreat, and his life was forever changed. He started HHP in April of 2017 **“because I wanted to give my fellow veterans a way to heal their PTSD that had worked for me.”**

While HHP’s number one priority is always the direct care of veterans, we’re also working tirelessly to support research and advocacy efforts to improve access to psychedelics, offer programs for veteran spouses to better nurture the entire veteran family, and foster a community in which veterans can grow and give back to others who are suffering.

This year, we proudly expanded our organization by establishing chapters in the UK and Canada, extending our mission to provide support and healing opportunities to even more individuals around the world.
