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LETTER FROM JESSE



2024 was a year of real progress for Heroic Hearts Project — and for the growing movement to bring psychedelic healing home to veterans and their families.

One of our most meaningful milestones was beginning to scale our first-of-its-kind legal psychedelic retreat program in Oregon. After years of sending veterans abroad for care, being able to offer this level of support on U.S. soil is something we've been working toward for a long time. These retreats aren't just symbolic — they're already changing lives and showing what's possible when healing is delivered in a safe, thoughtful, and community-based way.

After coming together with The Hope Project in 2023, we used 2024 to fully integrate veteran spouses and partners into our programming. Our first year of spouse retreats made it clear how deeply the entire family is impacted by trauma — and how powerful it is when they're included in the healing process. When veterans and their loved ones heal together, the impact isn't just added — it's multiplied. The ripple effects reach further, and the healing holds deeper.

We also expanded our educational mission with the launch of the Veterans Guide to Psychedelics, created in collaboration with author Matt Zemon. This resource gives veterans clear, accessible information about psychedelic therapies — what they are, how they work, and how to approach them safely and responsibly. It's already become one of our most requested tools and has helped countless veterans take the first step toward healing.

Beyond the retreats and education, we built real momentum in Washington D.C.. In partnership with Healing Breakthrough and a coalition of veteran-focused organizations, we raised awareness and continued pushing for policy changes that will make these treatments available within the system. Through these efforts, we laid the groundwork for a major partnership with Healing Breakthrough in 2025 — one that will accelerate our impact and bring this care to even more people.

This year was about building. Building access. Building trust. And building the foundation for what comes next. We're getting closer to a future where this kind of care isn't the exception — it's a recognized, respected, and easily accessible path to healing. Thank you for being with us on this journey.

2024 marked a significant evolution in our retreat program offerings for veterans. For the first time, we ran a full calendar year of legal psilocybin retreats in Oregon — bringing this powerful healing modality home to U.S. soil. These domestic retreats allowed us to serve veterans in a safe, familiar setting with culturally attuned facilitators and the same depth of care we've honed over years abroad. At the same time, we continued to expand our international retreat offerings, hosting more global programs than ever before. This dual approach gave veterans more options to access healing — whether close to home or in the trusted international environments that have long been part of our model. Across all locations, the goal remained the same: deliver safe, supported, life-changing experiences that help veterans reclaim their lives.

HHP's flagship international retreat program continued growing in 2024, with 24 international retreats in total. We successfully executed 18 retreats in Peru (two of which were researchfocused retreats in partnership with Onaya Science) and 6 retreats in Mexico. We served 189 total veterans including:

135 Male (71.1%), 54 Female (28.4%), 1 Non-Binary (0.5%)

SPECIAL POPULATIONS:

40 Special Operations (32.3%), 29 Military Sexual Trauma (23.4%), 25 BIPOC (20.1%), 30 LGBTQIA+ (24.2%)

Our international retreat program continues to be a space to honor and deepen our understanding of the traditional wisdom surrounding plant medicine/psychedelic healing, to further observational psychedelic research for veterans, and to showcase the stories and impact of psychedelic healing. We had the privilege of hosting Anderson Cooper and the 60 minutes team at one of our international retreats near Puerto Vallarta in 2024.

PORTLAND, OR BEND, OR

Heroic Hearts Project (HHP) is leading the way in providing veterans with safe, supported, and legal access to psychedelic retreat programs right here at home, in the United States.

After a successful pilot program in 2023, HHP offered 8 Oregon psilocybin retreat programs for veterans in 2024, completing 16 group psilocybin administration sessions and serving a total of 58 veterans, that included:

GENDER:

36x Male (62%), 21x Female (36%), 1x Non-Binary (2%)

SPECIAL POPULATIONS:

9x Special Operations (15%), 17x Military Sexual Trauma (29%), 5x BIPOC (9%), 9x LGBTQIA+ (15%)

We've also scaled our Domestic Retreat support team by providing education and facilitator licensure to 6 HHP facilitators and partnering with the teams at <u>InnerTrek</u> and <u>Cora Center</u> in Portland and <u>Bend Inner Alchemy</u> and <u>Bendable Therapy</u> in Bend, OR.

LETTER FROM ALLISON





Dear Friends of The Hope Project,

Gratitude is the word that comes to mind—gratitude for the trust, support, and community that has stood beside us this past year. 2024 was one to remember. Five years ago, The Hope Project was just a thought I had after an impactful journey of my own, following 16 years as a Navy SEAL spouse and mother of five. It began with a simple truth: spouses were holding so much, yet had little of their own. It was always about the veteran—but not about the family, the glue holding it all together. The Hope Project gave spouses a space of their own, and in that space, healing began. We've watched women rediscover themselves, and in doing so, we've witnessed families start to heal across generations.

Following our merger with Heroic Hearts Project, that vision has only expanded. In 2024, we supported the first-ever legal veteran spouse retreat in the U.S., and brought over 20 spouses to their own dedicated retreat in Mexico. Our community has now grown to over 300 women and includes weekly calls, retreats, coaching, family support, and healing modalities both inside and outside of psychedelic work. To date, we've awarded 65 retreat scholarships and offered coaching to over 200 spouses while their veterans embarked on their own journeys.

Hope has lived up to its name—and we're just getting started. With new secondary PTSD research underway, plans to host 8–10 retreats a year across Mexico, Oregon, and Colorado, and continued integration support through multiple wellness paths, the work ahead is exciting. None of this would be possible without our incredible team of coaches, clinicians, staff—and, of course, your generous support. Thank you for giving spouses and families the hope they deserve.

THEhope

2024 marked The Hope Project's first full year offering in-house retreats designed specifically for Gold Star Spouses and the partners and spouses of veterans and active duty service members. These retreats follow the same trusted 5-step process as Heroic Hearts Project's veteran retreats, while placing special emphasis on integration and community building as essential pillars of long-term healing.

This year, we also scaled our first-of-its-kind spouse and women's community, offering weekly support group calls, open integration circles, experiential workshops, TRE (Tension & Trauma Releasing Exercises) classes, and more. These offerings created a consistent container of caremeeting participants where they are, helping them feel less alone, and empowering them to take ownership of their healing in community with others who truly understand.

The Hope Project is proud to serve all veteran partners—past or present, regardless of whether their veteran has participated in our program, and across all branches and ranks. Our mission is to ensure that those standing beside our nation's service members are seen, supported, and offered the opportunity to heal.











In 2024, The Hope Project made history by launching the first-ever legal psilocybin retreat program for veteran spouses and partners in Oregon. These groundbreaking retreats created an accessible space for deep community healing on U.S. Soil.

We've long known that trauma doesn't exist in isolation. By offering this healing to veteran spouses, we're strengthening entire families and deepening the impact of our work with veterans. This is a vital step toward building a more complete model of care — one that honors the full experience and impact of military service.

RESEARCH



This work builds on previous research which found that ayahuasca, when taken in traditional ceremonial practices, leaves epigenetic marks on genes associated with trauma. This study aims to build upon these findings in an effort to clarify the biological networks that ceremonial ayahuasca may be impacting.

Our goal is to learn more about how brain function is influenced by an ayahuasca retreat program and how this may impact psychiatric symptoms related to post-traumatic stress disorder.



Imperial College London

This ongoing survey-based research is aimed at understanding the impacts of HHP's psychedelic program on PTSD symptoms and overall wellbeing for participants.

Further observational research will examine the effects of psilocybin ceremonies on the impacts of Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) in veterans.

The Hope Project launched the first-ever research initiative focused on the potential of using psychedelics to treat Secondary PTSD in veteran spouses and Gold Star Spouses. This includes expanding our collaboration with Imperial College London to study veteran spouses and partnering with Invi Mind Health to leverage wearable technology for tracking biomarker changes throughout and following participation in THP's program.





HHP is in the early stages of developing a new research initiative exploring the impacts of breathwork on veterans with Post Traumatic Stress symptoms.




Supporting Psychedelic Treatment is Patriotic

Our first-ever Operation: Freedom to Heal Gala in Los Angeles was a landmark moment for Heroic Hearts Project — and a resounding success. Held in the heart of LA with an unforgettable performance by Melissa Etheridge, the event brought together 230 attendees, including key leaders, advocates, and influencers in the psychedelic and veteran mental health space. With a sold-out crowd and electric energy, the night served as both a powerful celebration and a clear signal that the movement to bring psychedelic healing home is gaining serious momentum.

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we raised over \$450,000 to expand access to psychedelic retreat programs here in the U.S. We're especially grateful to our incredible sponsors, including the Etheridge Foundation, Future Venture, No Fallen Heroes, Beond, and Dr. Bronners, whose partnership made this evening possible. These funds are already helping lay the groundwork for veteran and family care in 2025 and beyond. 




ADVOCACY



In 2024, California continued to lead in psychedelic policy reform. Despite SB 58's setbacks, it paved the way for SB 751, which proposed state-supported psychedelic therapy pilots for veterans. Heroic Hearts Project played an instrumental role, partnering with legislators to prioritize veterans' needs including mobilizing veteran advocates, hosting educational briefings, and expanding public awareness and understanding around the potential use of regulated psychedelic care—positioning California as a model for responsible access to breakthrough mental health treatments.

2024 marked a breakthrough year for psychedelic advocacy in Massachusetts. As grassroots campaigns expanded city by city, momentum grew around a statewide initiative to legalize therapeutic access. Heroic Hearts Project amplified veteran voices through testimony, coalition—building, and public education—ensuring veterans and their families were seen as leaders in the movement, not just recipients of care. Though the ballot measure didn't pass, Massachusetts is now on a clear path toward regulated access, driven by community and veteran–led advocacy.





2024 was a pivotal year for MDMA-assisted therapy, the first treatment in line for FDA approval. As MAPS PBC submitted its final FDA application, Heroic Hearts Project ramped up federal advocacy, partnering with Healing Breakthrough to push for veteran access to these treatments through the VA. We brought veterans to Capitol Hill, educated stakeholders using science-based evidence, and built bipartisan coalitions to emphasize the urgency of legal access. HHP helped shape the national conversation around what a safe, equitable federal rollout of MDMA therapy should look like. Our message was clear: veterans shouldn't have to wait.

MDMA CAMPAIGN

Heroic Hearts Project collaborated with advocacy partners to urge the FDA to approve MDMA-assisted therapy for PTSD. Backed by rigorous science and compelling veteran testimony, the message was clear: this treatment saves lives and is significantly more effective than existing options. Our campaign generated over 2.5 million impressions and helped mobilize bipartisan support, including letters from over 700 veterans and 80 lawmakers to the FDA Commissioner advocating for approval.

While the FDA ultimately declined to approve MDMA-assisted therapy in 2024, the decision does not erase the progress made. The momentum our community built marks a turning point in the fight for broader access to effective, life-saving care.

Experts Endorse MDMA-assisted Therapy for PTSD

Re: Lykos Therapeutics NDA #215455, Midomafetamine (MDMA) for use in the treatment of PTSD

To Whom It May Concern:

We, the undersigned researchers and clinicians, are writing to express our professional assessment of the treatment for PTSD using midomafetamine (MDMA) that is under consideration by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. On the basis of the safety and efficacy data we have seen, assuming the integrity of the data is validated by the relevant regulators, and in light of the very urgent and widespread unmet need for effective treatments for PTSD, we believe that midomafetamine (MDMA) is now approvable for use with therapy in the treatment of PTSD, given suitable safeguards and post-approval monitoring.





In late 2024, Heroic Hearts Project made the strategic decision to formally join forces with Healing Breakthrough through a unification in January 2025. For years, HHP has demonstrated the lifechanging power of psychedelic healing for veterans and their families through our retreat programs, coaching, and community care.

During that time, Healing Breakthrough has been at the forefront of federal advocacy, opening hearts and minds in the VA and on Capitol Hill. By joining forces, we're aligning two powerful missions—direct healing and systemic change—to ensure that no veteran is left waiting for access to care.

Together, we will scale our model, strengthen our unified voice in policy, and accelerate the cultural shift toward public acceptance of psychedelic-assisted therapy as a standard, trusted path for treating military trauma.




