BREAKING NEW GROUND



2023 marked a milestone year for Heroic Hearts Project. This year, we helped a record number of veterans access life-altering psychedelic programs. We merged with The Hope Project, expanding our mission to include veteran spouses and families, reflecting our commitment to elevating the veteran ecosystem holistically. We initiated the nation's first legal psilocybin retreat program for veterans on U.S. soil, bringing our framework for psychedelic healing opportunities directly to our community in the United States. Heroic Hearts Project Australia was launched. As we look back on our tremendous growth in 2023 and over the past seven years, we are reminded that this year's achievements are only the beginning of an expanding horizon for both our organization and the broader psychedelic landscape for veterans.

The Hope Project Empowering Veteran Families

Bringing Psychedelic Programs for Veterans to the USA

In 2017 HHP created the first veteran psychedelic program and revolutionized how veterans can access life-saving mental health treatment. To date, we have supported over 1,000 veteran families internationally and we are now at the forefront of making this care accessible to veteran families on home soil in the USA. To do this, we:

- Launched the first legal psilocybin treatment program for veterans in Oregon in November, 2023
- Are partnering with approved local providers to directly offer legal, veteran-focused psychedelic care, with continued, in-person support.
- Have developed a self-sustaining model that can be replicated at scale as the laws around psychedelic treatment change in more states.
- Are committed to furthering the wellbeing of both veterans and their communities by offering training scholarships for qualified program alumni to become coaches, supporters, facilitators for future retreats.

2023 RESEARCH

For the past seven years, HHP has understood the value that research brings when it comes to expanding access to life-saving alternative treatments for veterans and beyond. We've pushed the envelope by partnering with leading universities and research organizations to study the mental, emotional, physiological, and spiritual impacts of these tools, and we are committed to openly sharing our findings because rising tides lift all ships. The studies below launched in 2023.



University of Texas, Austin Launched January, 2023

This study, launched in partnership with UT, Austin, is researching the efficacy of psilocybin and 5MeO-DMT for Gold Star Spouses and other female family members of soldiers lost in the line of duty.



Onaya Science Launched March, 2023

We've partnered with Onaya Science and the Ayahuasca Foundation to study both the physiological and psychological impacts of traditional ayahuasca ceremonies for veterans.

Imperial College, London Launched March, 2023

Imperial College London

This study with Imperial College, London is sponsored by Beckley Retreats. The observational research will examine the effects of psilocybin ceremonies on the impacts of Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) in veterans


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



BILLS AND POLICY MAKING

In March, HHP supported the Psychedelic Medicine Coalition at the Capitol with Tim Ferris, Rick Doblin, Dr. Matthew Johnson and Matthew "Whiz" Buckley. The group advocated for "The Need for Federal Funding in Psychedelic Research," and our founder Jesse Gould, spoke in front of lawmakers about the impact psychedelic research can have on veterans.

We sponsored California bill SB 58, which advocated for the decriminalization of various psychedelic substances, such as psilocybin, DMT, and mescaline. While the bill passed in the House, Senate and Committees, it was ultimately vetoed by Governor Gavin Newsom.



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Jesse Gould and Allison Wilson spoke at The Department of Veterans Affairs Office of Mental Health and Suicide Prevention (OMHSP) and Office of Research and Development (ORD)'s State-of-the-Art (SOTA) conference on "Psychedelic Treatments for Mental Health Conditions" in September. The conference included a working meeting for federal executive branch employees focused on developing strategic plans and agency policies.

Throughout the year, Jesse and team made numerous trips to Capitol Hill in support of federal policy initiatives aimed at increasing research and access to psychedelic treatments. HHP has always worked closely with groups like Reason For Hope, Healing Breakthrough, and the Psychedelic Medicine Coalition to best represent the veteran voice to policy makers.

The origins of HHP trace back to the profound personal journey of our founder, Jesse Gould, a former Army Ranger whose battle with severe PTSD led him to seek healing beyond traditional methods. His transformative experience at an ayahuasca retreat in the Peruvian jungle provided not just relief but a new direction in life. Moved by his own recovery, Jesse was compelled to create a pathway for his fellow veterans to find similar healing.

"Before Heroic Hearts, I was at my lowest point, feeling disconnected and hopeless. As my own pain began to lift, I knew I couldn't keep this journey to myself. I feel extremely fortunate that I found a safe psychedelic retreat in my time of need. But I also had to approach it without support. HHP is not about subjecting veterans to yet another treatment for their symptoms. It's about empowering veterans and their loved ones to embark on real, transformative experiences and to take their healing into their own hands. It's about ensuring that no one in this community feels alone or unsupported as they begin the deep work of unpacking trauma and reclaiming inner peace. This is not just my mission—it's a call to action for the healing, understanding, and compassion that everyone in the military community deserves."

Looking ahead, HHP is committed to expanding its reach and deepening its impact. The organization continues to sit at the forefront of the integration of psychedelic healthcare for veterans into mainstream acceptance and envisions a future where every veteran has access to the tools needed for substantial and sustainable healing.




